

Dear Friends – Shalom Chaverim,

The past few months have been rough, with the vicious Hamas attack on Israelis and the eruption of anti-Israel, anti-Jewish rallies around the



world. There is a lot of uncertainty these days, so rather than dwelling on all that cannot be known about the future, let me share with you three things I *do* know.*

#1: Community is everything. During this difficult, painful, and confusing time for us, it has been amazing to watch the people in Israel immediately pull together to help one another in any way possible, from preparing food for displaced families, to sending healthy snacks to the soldiers, to taking people into their homes. For us here as well, sharing our thoughts, feelings, and prayers together has been helpful and given us strength. This is what it means to be part of a community. We may feel the pain of what many experienced these last weeks, but we also feel our strength by being together in community.

#2: Shabbat is a gift. Shabbat reminds us to unplug for a bit; it's okay to detach from the news, from work, and from stress. Turn Friday night into Shabbos: light some candles, drink some wine, have a relaxed meal, take a few deep breaths, and think about what you are grateful for. Let go of the stimulation from the phone or computer for a few hours and you may begin to feel a bit better.

#3: This is not the end of the story. As Rabbi Samuels wrote so reassuringly, "The burden of these terrible days will not last forever". I believe her! We are changed and deeply affected by what happened, but we will be resilient and hopeful about our future, both as Jewish people and as human beings working to make our world a better place.

Over 2,000 years ago, our sages also talked about "three things" – each with their own view of what the three things are! Shimon the Righteous came up with a motto: "Al shloshah devarim haOlam omed: al haTorah, v'al haAvodah, v'al gemilut chasadim." ("The world stands on three things: the Torah, worship, and loving acts of kindness.") (Mishnah, Pirkey Avot 1:2). Another sage, also named Shimon, Rabbi Shimon ben Gamliel, added his own three values: "Al shloshah devarim haOlam kayam: al haEmet, v'al haDin, v'al haShalom." ("The world stands on three things: on Truth, on Judgment, and on Peace.") (Pirkey Avot 1:18). These sages were spot-on. May the new year bring each of us renewed strength to work toward bringing these qualities and traits to our broken world.

To qualify, transfer must go directly from your IRA to CBE.


Gifts made from your IRA are not reportable as taxable income.







Observing Yahrzeits at CBE

A yahrzeit is the anniversary of a death. It is traditional to light a 24-hour memorial candle in your home, at sundown on the evening before the date of the yahrzeit.

Names of the remembered are read out at Shabbat services on the Friday night immediately preceding the yahrzeit date. Friends and family attend this service, and participate in the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish. Many people also make a donation to the temple in honor of the remembered, as a mitzvah on behalf of a loved one who is no longer here to do so.

Those who have yahrzeits on file with the Temple office will receive reminders before the dates. We ask for your help in keeping this information current and complete.
