Rabbi's Message

Dear Friends,

You may have heard about the “conference” debating whether or not the Holocaust happened, hosted by Iran’s President Mahmood Ahmadinejad, in December. While we tend to see the Holocaust and its vast devastation on European Jewry as another significant and valid reason to support Israel as a Jewish and democratic country, Ahmadinejad has made it clear that his public Holocaust denial is a pretext for his desire to destroy the State of Israel. His virulent, vitriolic and boldly stated anti-Semitism is both frightening and alarming. One positive response did come from a group of Iranian students. Publicly demonstrating against their president, they protested the “shameful conference” which “brought Nazis and racists to our country from around the world.”



April will bring two important dates to express our supportive sentiments on the importance of both Holocaust commemoration and Israel’s strength and existence. On Friday night April 13th, we will remember those who perished in the Holocaust and honor those who escaped at a special Yom HaShoah service. Our own Mrs. Peppi Lamm will tell of her experiences about her family from Germany, and how she and her sister, as young teenagers, escaped to relative safety in England. The choir will also sing special songs that night. Following this, we will celebrate Israel’s independence and sovereignty as a modern country at our service on Friday April 27th.

Please join us at these special services to learn more about and to honor our people and our history. Invite your friends to join us too.

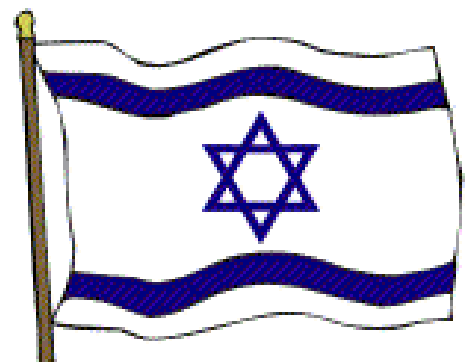
