It is for this reason that we laugh on Purim, not ribald laughter, but laughter born of faith and joy in the amazing survival of our people. Besides the reading of the *Megillah* and a spirit of joy, Purim is also marked by a sense of thanksgiving with sending gifts to friends and those in need. May we continue to celebrate and enjoy our Jewish heritage in our time of freedom.

We will sing songs (from a "cool" powerpoint presentation) and watch the story of Purim presented by our 6th grade students, with an appearance by the evil *Haman*! (boo, hiss!... Sorry, Mr. Shore!) 

Notes from the Cantor by Cantor Michael Russ

Perhaps the greatest story of our Jewish History is the Exodus from Egypt. It is the story of the struggle of our people to break the chains of slavery, to become a free people, and to make our own history with the help of God. It was not then, and still is not now, an easy struggle. Some of the difficulty in our ancient story was with the Pharaoh who kept changing his mind about letting the Hebrews free. (It seems that the new "Pharaoh" recently had the same problem). Another problem was the struggle of the Hebrew people to actually believe it was possible for the great miracles of allowing God to deliver them from slavery, experiencing freedom and accepting God's help with building a new community: "The Children of Israel". With new laws from God, we would become who we are today with a homeland of Israel and a positive spiritual bond that has held us together for centuries.

As we watch events unfold in Egypt and other places in the Mideast today, we have many concerns of what will happen next. How will this affect the world? How will this affect Israel? How will this affect the United States of America? But what about the question . . . "How does this affect the people of Egypt? What will be their response to their own freedom?

Just as our ancestors discovered the meaning, significance, and responsibility of freedom, so do these new Egyptians need to learn the meaning of their own freedom. This is a new experience for them. We should hope and pray that they will experience and appreciate what freedom truly means. As they struggle to rebuild their country, let us pray that they understand that peace is also an important factor in their newfound freedom. The protestors we watched on TV were, for the most part, peaceful. Without a strong individual such as Moses, they prayed to God and did the work to overthrow the tyrannical leader of Egypt. And, so far, they have won.

In addition to Passover, the story of Purim is also a springtime celebration. Esther and Mordechai were cautious and kept aware of the events and personalities of those in power. They kept their eyes open and their ears listening to realize Haman's treachery. The fact that Esther was the new queen did not make her and her people immune from disaster. They dealt with the problem in a clever way, and, in the end, they triumphed.

We, too, must keep vigil and understand what is happening. We must guard against a possible new "Haman." However, we should encourage and celebrate the newfound freedom of the Egyptians. Perhaps, as they struggle with their own freedom, they will learn to respect the rights of others. It was so encouraging to see that as the Muslims in Tehrar Square were praying one day, the Christian Egyptians formed a circle around them so they would not be disturbed by the "anti-demonstrators." Another day, the Christians prayed while the Muslims made a human shield

Respect for others and praying for freedom and democracy of the Egyptians should not be equated with asking for troubles for Israel. We, and Israel, must be ever vigilant of the developments in Egypt. We must be aware of the possible evil influences (such as a Haman) in their struggle. However, there is always the chance that, as the Egyptian people discover their own freedom and experience their own peace and prosperity, they will lose hatred in their hearts and realize that everyone is better off if we could live in peace.

When we pray for peace in the world it cannot be for us alone, but for everyone, or else there really is no peace. When someone is ill, we recite the "Mi Shebeirach" Prayer. We pray to God for healing. The world needs healing.

"May the source of strength, who blessed the ones before us, help us find the courage to make our lives a blessing. Bless those in need of healing with 'r'fua sh'leima': the renewal of body the renewal of spirit, and let us say: Amen."





How to observe a Yahrzeit at C.B.E

It is also customary to attend Shabbat services at Temple and recite the Kaddish. At Congregation B'nai Emet, names of your loved ones are read on the Friday evening **before** the Yahrzeit. If you observe the Gregorian (English) date, the name will be read following the yahrzeit date. It is suggested that you make a contribution to the Temple so that the memory of your loved one can be honored with an act of love and kindness.



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
