Rabbi's Message—How we love our pets!



Dear Friends – Shalom Chaverim!

A man went to the Rabbi and said "Rabbi, my beloved dog died. I am so sad, can you say Kaddish for him?" The Rabbi responded: "I'm sorry, we can't say Kaddish for an animal. Maybe try the other synagogue in town." The man said: "Oh, too bad, I was going to make an \$85,000 donation too." The Rabbi quickly said: "You didn't tell me your dog was Jewish!"

As far back as the book of Genesis, we find laws which teach us compassion for animals. Even the mitzvah of observing Sabbath rest is extended to our animals. The Rabbis used a term *tzaar baalei chayim* "compassion for the pain of living animals" to teach that people must care for their animals with kindness and compassion. The Talmud teaches, "You may not eat your own meal until you have seen to it that all your animals have been fed" (Berachot 40a). I am proud to be part of a tradition that regards the life of all of God's creatures as sacred. And certainly many of us who have pets truly love our animals and find them to be a great source of joy in our lives.

In honor of our pets, I invite you to our first "Pet Parade" on Sunday afternoon June 27th at 3:30 on our front lawn at the Temple. Animal behaviorist Jody Epstein will lead a special training session for us; I will briefly discuss the "spirituality that animals bring to our lives" and even have a special blessing for our animals, then we will share some treats (human food for us, animal food for the *chayas*- animals!).

SHAVUOT – THE NEXT JEWISH HOLIDAY!

"Shavuot" or "Shavuos" is the next holiday we'll celebrate, on June 9-10. While originally it was a harvest holiday, the rabbis of the talmudic period gave this holiday a new historical connection – namely that it celebrates the giving of the Torah at Mt. Sinai. This is a powerful and meaningful image which strengthens our connection to the Torah and to generations past and it becomes as if we, too, are actually receiving the Torah ourselves!

The Torah is our most sacred object for it contains our holy teachings, our sacred stories, our covenant with God. One Chassidic teacher wrote, "We study Torah for no other reason than this: that by studying Torah we might become Torah." In other words, we study to learn and to be uplifted by our religious and moral teachings. The Zohar, the main book of Jewish mysticism, notes, "If you study the Torah, you are joined to the Tree of Life" (152b).

As we approach the Shavuot holiday, I hope you will renew and strengthen your commitment to Jewish life, values and learning. Read a Jewish book, study a little Torah, come by the synagogue and be an active part of Jewish life in Simi Valley. We will celebrate Shavuot together on Friday May 21st.

We will be having Shabbat services throughout the summer – I hope to see you!

How to observe a Yahrzeit at C.B.E






