## Rabbi's Message

Dear Friends – Shalom Chaverim!

As I write this article, I am currently in Israel. I hope each one of you will make the effort to visit *our* beautiful and amazing country of the Jewish people! It is truly a place of miracles, despite all of the odds, and you won't be disappointed! Yes, there are threats to her very existence, but once you are here, you will see a vibrant, modern, exciting country. Immediately you are caught up in the hustle, bustle and exuberance of everyday life and can really begin to appreciate how much this small country has accomplished. There are sophisticated large office and apartment buildings, ancient landmarks for Jews and Christians, great shops, high tech centers and beautiful nature sites all around. What strikes me the most during my first few days here is what a youthful and warm culture Israel is. There are so many people out, eating in the cafes, enjoying the cool evening breeze at the beaches with family and friends, and of course, visiting the various interesting sites all over the country.



I read that the world is soon to reach a population of 7 billion people! It is my feeling that we have to keep alive our people, our history, our culture and our beautiful land of Israel – not out of obligation or pity, but out of joy, pride and delight!

Once again the High Holy Days are upon us. And once again their eternal message hits home. Change is not only possible, it's part and parcel with what it means to be human.

Traditionally, our very lives were thought to hang upon a tenuous thread during the ten Days of Awe. Those who were completely good were sealed immediately in the Book of Life, and those who were thoroughly evil were omitted. The rest, the vast majority of us, were left to try and alter our destinies through self-improvement so that we would be sealed in the Book of Life for the New Year.

The imagery of this ancient metaphor still speaks to us today. Contrary to what many religions have taught, and contrary to many a common adage ("you can't change human nature"), human beings *can* change. Indeed our religion teaches us that change, based upon choices between good and evil, is an integral part of our relationship with God. The Torah teaches us, "... *I have set before thee life and death, the blessing and the curse; therefore, choose life, that thou mayest live...*" (Deut. 30:19).

For many, choosing life means choosing to change, choosing to break free from who we have been, and to become what in the depths of our hearts we know we can be.

Fortunately, in this struggle, we are not alone. God is with us. Our sages portray God as saying to us: "*If you will open the door of repentance only as wide as a needle's eye, I will open it wide enough for carriages and wagons to pass through.*"

You can't change human nature? Perhaps. But then, it's human nature to change human actions, and that's what these High Holy Days are all about! I look forward to seeing you at the Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur services. Don't be a stranger!

L'Shannah Tovah - to a good and happy year for us all.

On September 23 a representative of the Transition House will speak at our Shabbat Service to tell us about this organization. We plan to do some collection activities for items they need during **Mitzvah Day** and throughout the year.

Our **Feed the Needy** program was handled in July by Lindy Schneider and our Preschool and in August by Deborah Bass and her friends and family. Thanks to all those who helped. If you would like to help with this program, please contact the Temple office. It takes so little of your time to help out one month and it means so much for the people who need our help. ## Jewish Life Center

On August 12, 2009, the Jewish Life Center of Simi Valley, voted to dissolve and turn its assets and liabilities over to Congregation B'nai Emet for future control. This has been a much discussed topic at JLC Board meetings over the past year. The members agreed that this was the best decision for the Jewish community in our area.

The mission of the JLC was to create a home for the Jewish community of Simi Valley/Moorpark and surrounding towns. It was determined that CBE and its board of directors could continue those goals to establish a permanent home for our congregation, Preschool, and religious school. Those entities could also present the same positive values about Jewish Life to the community as the JLC had intended. This action was not taken lightly or without regard for our supporters and our mission statement. Our board feels strongly that its endeavors will continue with a new emphasis and enthusiasm.

The attorney for the JLC has been informed of the vote and issued instructions for our board and CBE to follow according to the guidelines of the State Attorney General's office. The process should take 90 to 120 days to complete and get the OK from the Attorney General.

On behalf of the JLC Board of Directors, I would like to thank all of you who have supported our efforts financially, spiritually or both. We look forward to the day when, as Jews of this community, we have a permanent home for ourselves, our children and many future generations.

With the sale of Royal/Corto still in progress and therefore, the purchase of the Bonita property not complete, the JLC board felt this was the time for the dissolution. A letter reviewing this process will also be sent out soon to all of our Jewish Life Center donors. Thank you.

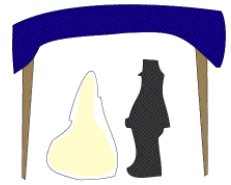

### How to observe a Yahrzeit at C.B.E

Light a 24-hour memorial candle in your home at sundown on the evening that begins the yahrzeit (anniversary of death.) It is also customary to attend Shabbat services at Temple and recite the Kaddish. At Congregation B'nai Emet, names of your loved ones are read on the Friday evening **before** the Yahrzeit. If you observe the **Gregorian (English)** date, the name will be read **following** the yahrzeit date. It is suggested that you make a contribution to the Temple so that the memory of your loved one can be honored with an act of love and kindness.
