rendering of the Aleinu prayer, for inspiration:

Hallowing

It is up to us to hallow Creation, to respond to Life with the fullness of our lives. It is up to us to meet the World. to embrace the Whole even as we wrestle with its parts. It is up to us to repair the World and to bind our lives to Truth. So shake off the stiffness that keeps you from the subtle graces of Life and the supple gestures of Love. With reverence and thanksgiving accept your destiny and set for yourself the task of redemption.

This poem/prayer is a modern interpretation, but it reflects an ancient tradition. The Talmud teaches:

By ten things is the world created, by wisdom and understanding, and by reason and by strength, by rebuke and by might, by righteousness and by judgment, by loving-kindness and by compassion.

~Haqiqa 12a

The Talmudic Rabbis saw these as attributes and abilities of God, but we, too, can live them as a way to create the world we wish to see.

I'd like to invite you to get involved at CBE. There are so many ways to do it: come back to shul for services when we're in the Temple each month; lead a prayer or give a Shabbat morning Devar Torah; help with a program or fundraising activity; join the choir; volunteer to help with Religious School; and many, many more. 

Presidential Ponderings



Shalom CBE Family and Friends,

This is the time when most of us reflect on the events of the past year and what may be in store for next year. To say we have returned to normalcy is not even close. COVID-19, Year

Two, has been as disruptive to our daily lives as COVID-19, Year One. Who would have ever thought that a tiny, little, microscopic organism could play such havoc with our lives and the world around us in this, the 21st Century?

In spite of the limitations Congregation B'nai Emet has had to endure, we have continued to be a viable representative of the local Jewish Community. Although not running at 100% capacity, the Temple has been able to resume some live activities, albeit limiting the number of attendees, and requiring masks and vaccinations. This was true for the lovely High Holy Days services at Mt. Sinai, and for some Friday and Saturday morning Shabbat services in our own sanctuary. We also slipped in three Shabbat Under the Stars services on our beautiful patio. We did build our Sukkah once again. Families enjoyed participating with individual meals instead of sharing pot luck style. For those who were unable to attend live services, or were simply not comfortable with in-person gatherings, we raised over \$10,000 through our "Buy A Cam" campaign, organized by VP of Fundraising Brian Marcus. This allowed us to purchase the equipment necessary to simultaneously provide participatory Zoom access to all the live events mentioned above. All the accolades for getting (and keeping) everything up and running go to our Dream Team, our very own "Geek" squad: Steve Rossman, Max Patera, Ken Bahr, and Michael Hollander.

What we have *not* been able to do is hold live fundraising events: wine tasting and charcuterie, a talent show where members strut their stuff, a New Year's Eve banquet with silent auctions, and movie days with popcorn and drinks. I know we are all looking forward to a return to the "old" days, when we can feel comfortable in groups, not wearing masks, and not worrying about current and future variants of COVID.

Even with the uncertainty of not knowing when we will be able to resume live fundraisers, our financial committee has succeeded in staying within the confines of our very conservative budget. Over the past two years, we have weathered fairly well financially, keeping fine watch on our income versus expenses. Thanks to good, solid financial planning, we have met our fiduciary responsibilities.

As we come to the close of this year, some of our senior members, aged 70½, will be required to take an RMD, a Required Minimum Distribution from their traditional IRAs or other retirement accounts. Please consider making a direct distribution from your brokerage or bank account to CBE. There are two benefits to this type of withdrawal from your account. Benefit (1), you will not be taxed on your withdrawal by the Federal government, if your annual distribution is made directly by the custodian of your account to CBE. Benefit (2), CBE will receive a very-much-needed donation. (Note: this distribution does not apply to Roth IRAs or any other Roth retirement accounts.)

For you youngsters less than age 70½, if you feel you are financially fortunate to be able to make a year-end donation to CBE, please, please, please, do so. As you have heard me say so many times, no donation is too small but the bigger the better. May I suggest multiples of Chai: \$18, \$36, \$54, \$72, \$90, \$108...I could go on and on, the sky's the limit, but I am only asking for what is in your comfort zone.


All women are welcome at our programs, and we need you! Members will be called in January about serving on the Board. Please consider giving some of your time and effort to our worthy endeavors.










Schedule of Shabbat Services, Candle Lightings, & Torah Portions



Observing Yahrzeits at CBE

A yahrzeit is the anniversary of a death. It is traditional to light a 24-hour memorial candle in your home, at sundown on the evening before the date of the yahrzeit.

Names of the remembered are read out at Shabbat services on the Friday night immediately preceding the yahrzeit date. Friends and family attend this service, and participate in the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish. Many people also make a donation to the temple in honor of the remembered, as a mitzvah on behalf of a loved one who is no longer here to do so.

Those who have yahrzeits on file with the Temple office will receive reminders before the dates. We ask for your help in keeping this information current and complete. To check, change, or add to the current yahrzeit information on file, please contact the office.


