Praying in the Comfort Zone!

Dear Friends – Shalom Chaverim!

For several years the Reform Movement of Judaism has been in the process of creating a new prayer book which is now available! It is called *Mishkan T'filah* which means *Tabernacle of Prayer* and is a reference to the portable sanctuary our ancestors made as they journeyed through the Wilderness of Sinai to the Promised Land. *Mishkan T'filah* is an exciting and dynamic prayer book that builds on the previous books we have used, and also breaks new ground. The editors of this book have been very careful to embrace our past, take hold of the present and look to the future. While our services are lovely and uplifting, using an updated prayer book with

transliterations and more readings to choose from should be exciting for us all!

Ultimately, our new prayer book will continue to present the age-old challenge with which we have always struggled: finding meaning in prayer. By adapting a new, more contemporary prayer book we are taking a chance, trying something new, stretching spiritually, and hopefully deepening our spiritual connection to God, ourselves and the Jewish people. In our prayers we strive to find our highest potential for self, a stronger sense of humanity and the idea that we are responsible for one another and the world.

A prayer book hopes to be a snapshot of the theology of those who use it. Gate of Prayer was first published in 1975; the new *Mishkan T'filah* incorporates many changes in wording and prayer that have developed over the years, has full transliterations and is designed to be a more “experiential” prayer book than others. The editors of our new *siddur* aim for the worshippers to engage in the prayers, not simply read and respond to them. So you will see that the set-up is different than that of previous prayer books, but with a little practice we will get used to it.

If you would like to buy your own prayer book for personal use, you can do so through the Temple office; also, you can purchase a prayer book for the Temple and dedicate it in honor or memory of a loved one. A beautiful book plate will list your dedication. I hope you will contribute to this important project.

Please join us on Friday night June 26th as we dedicate our new prayer book at our Shabbat service. I hope that you will join in this wonderful celebration as we move forward in our new home.

Jewish Life Center

As the Jewish Life Center proceeds through escrow on the sale of the Royal/Corto property, we are taking steps to streamline the transition to purchase the Bonita Drive property. One of those steps was for the temple to draw up an agreement with the Preschool. This will ensure a dedicated fundraising effort and ensure a secure future as we build a Preschool/Educational center.

The second step will be to dissolve and close the books on the current Jewish Life Center. This is a necessary step in the escrow process to secure the Bonita Drive location. When escrow closes, the property will be owned by Congregation B'nai Emet. The agreement I mentioned, however, gives shared control of the fundraising efforts and building plans to both the temple and the preschool. This is vitally important toward a productive joint future for the Jewish Community. Our future plans have always called for the temple and Preschool to be together at one location. This is a huge step toward that goal.

This has not been an easy process. Many have worked tirelessly to make this project a reality. Most recently, the last steps came about with some wonderful cooperation between members of three boards – the temple, JLC and Preschool. In particular, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Fawn Brodey, President of the CBE Preschool Board of Directors and Earl Rosado, President of Congregation B'nai Emet. These two leaders have shown what it takes to work together to achieve a common goal. The next people I wish to acknowledge and compliment are Nirit Levy, Michael Hollander, Lindy Schneider, Eric Bordo, Carole Fineberg and Nancy Micon. They worked many long hours on this process and were very instrumental in moving this along.

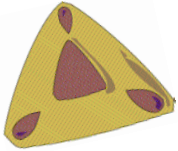
Once it is officially voted on by all boards, the Jewish Life Center will instruct its attorney to proceed with the necessary steps. There is a formal process that we must go through but our attorney sees no problems with the Attorney General of California approving it. This state office must grant permission when any profit or non profit corporation dissolves.

Thank you all for your patience as we proceed down this protracted real estate road. I'm sure we all look forward to the day when all parts of the CBE Family can call the Bonita Drive location "home".

SHAVUOT – THE NEXT JEWISH HOLIDAY!

“Shavuot” or “Shavuot” is the next holiday we’ll celebrate, on May 29-30. While originally it was a harvest holiday, the rabbis of the talmudic period gave this holiday a new historical connection – namely that it celebrates the giving of the Torah at Mt. Sinai. This is a powerful and meaningful image which strengthens our connection to the Torah and to generations past and it becomes as if we, too, are actually receiving the Torah ourselves!



The Torah is our most sacred object for it contains our holy teachings, our sacred stories, our covenant with God. One Chassidic teacher wrote, “We study Torah for no other reason than this: that by studying Torah we might become Torah.” In other words, we study to learn and to be uplifted by our religious and moral teachings. The Zohar, the main book of Jewish mysticism, notes, “If you study the Torah, you are joined to the Tree of Life” (152b).

As we approach the Shavuot holiday, I hope you will renew and strengthen your commitment to Jewish life, values and learning. Read a Jewish book, study a little Torah, come by the synagogue and be an active part of Jewish life in Simi Valley. We will be having Shabbat services throughout the summer – I hope to see you!

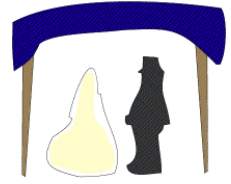

Light a 24-hour memorial candle in your home at sundown on the evening that begins the yahrzeit (anniversary of death.) It is also customary to attend Shabbat services at Temple and recite the Kaddish. At Congregation B'nai Emet, names of your loved ones are read on the Friday evening **before** the Yahrzeit. If you observe the **Gregorian (English)** date, the name will be read **following** the yahrzeit date. It is suggested that you make a contribution to the Temple so that the memory of your loved one can be honored with an act of love and kindness.
