#### Rabbi's Message: Israel Chai-lights - Israel at 60

Dear Friends – Shalom Chaverim!

I just returned from three wonderful weeks in Israel and would like to share some "chai-lights" and impressions with you. Although Israel is so strikingly different in some ways, Israel is our collective home. There is a special feeling for a Jewish person, and even for those who aren't Jewish, that comes with being in Israel: to marvel at the Holy Land and its accomplishments. While Hebrew is the official language, Israel is a very cosmopolitan country.

There were 38 people in our group, including six from CBE, plus myself and the boys. We took the 14 hour El-Al direct, non-stop flight from Los Angeles to Israel. When I went for a walk around the plane, (after about 6 or so hours of flying), I found the flight attendants handing out sandwiches and drinks to people in the back of the plane. Since people were sleeping, it was an "informal meal". I looked at Kathy Smith and said, "it's a Jewish flight, people are in the kitchen eating!"

We arrived in Tel-Aviv and were greeted by our Guide, Moshe Goldin. We stayed at the beautiful Carlton Hotel which is right on the Mediterranean Sea. Several of us went swimming in the sea, which was warm and refreshing. The Tel-Aviv beaches are very welcoming; there are chairs to sit on, cafes right on the sand ready to serve you and music playing. During the first few days in Tel-Aviv we visited several places that tell the history of Modern Israel, including Independence Hall, where Israel was proclaimed a state in 1948 and Kibbutz Yad Mordecai, which has a museum to honor those who fought in the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising. We had dinner in the old port city of Yafo, just south of Tel-Aviv, walked down to the port and read an excerpt from the Book of Jonah, which begins in Yafo (Jaffa).

On our third day we set out for Jerusalem. First we stopped at a military base where soldiers go for their refresher courses. We were greeted by the proud young men and women. They gave us an orientation of what they do and then took us to their shooting simulator range. It felt emotional watching real Israeli soldiers doing their target practice. A few moments later, they put down their rifles, turned to us, and we got to shoot at the targets! Needless to say, everyone found that very exciting! We went to a biblical nature preserve for lunch and learned how crops grew and were produced in ancient times. We planted almond trees there too. Then we took a beautiful new road into Jerusalem. Jerusalem is a strikingly beautiful city, with the white limestone buildings and walls surrounding the Old City, the large golden dome of the mosque, and the rocky, hilly surroundings. Jerusalem is about 2,400 feel above sea level; the air is clear and there is a special feeling in this unique city. We spent five nights in Jerusalem, including Shabbat, at the Sheraton Plaza Hotel. We visited the moving Yad VaShem Holocaust Memorial, the tunnel along the foundation of the Western Wall, walked through the Old City of Jerusalem, said our prayers at the Kotel, the Western Wall, and had a special tour of the Knesset. Some of the women and girls celebrated their Bat-Mitzvahs, wearing the new Tallitot that they bought, at a promenade that overlooks all of Jerusalem.

On Wednesday July 31<sup>st</sup> we left Jerusalem and headed north for Tiberias. Along the way we visited the ancient town of Bet Shean. This was both a Canaanite and later a Roman town. Then we ate lunch at the modern Bet Shean mall! Everyone loved that! Most of the McDonald's restaurants in Israel are kosher! (I noticed that even the ones that aren't certified kosher don't serve cheeseburgers or probably even non-kosher meat!) Over the next few days we did a lot of touring of the Galilee and the Golan Heights, even going to the Syrian and Lebanese borders. We walked through the mystical city of Zfat and also visited a winery.

We spent our second Shabbat in Haifa. On Saturday morning we went to Or Hadash Reform synagogue and were greeted very warmly by Rabbi Edgar Nof. After the service he showed us the bomb shelter which, unfortunately, they used for many days last summer. I think for most of the people in our group, it was the first time they've ever been in a bomb shelter. One of the most moving moments for me during our trip was when we read together the prayer for the safety of Israel's soldiers. I began thinking of the "kids" we had met at the Army base, and all of the soldiers you see all over the country. These are dedicated young adults, entrusted with the great responsibility of guarding and protecting this special land. At one point our guide made an important comment, explaining that the Israeli army is called "Tzahal", or in English, "IDF", the Israel Defense Forces. The army is there to defend and protect the people; it's not an attack or terrorist organization.

The *Interfaith Call to Justice: LA 2007*, scheduled for November 11-12, 2007, brings together people of faith with a burning desire to create justice in their local community. Hosting this gathering will be Temple Isaiah and its Senior Rabbi, Zoë Klein. The two-day social justice training and community strategy planning conference will educate and train religious leaders and their congregations about how to effect systemic change through legislative and public policy advocacy.

More than 60 faith-based organizations are cosponsoing this event. Keynote speakers include:

- ⇒Father Greg Boyle, Founder/Executive Director of Jobs For A Future/Homeboy Industries
- → Rev. Cecil "Chip" Murray, retired pastor of F.A.M.E. and current Chair of Christian Ethics at the University of Southern California
- → Rabbi David Saperstein, Director of the Religious Action Center of the Reform Movement of Judaism
- → Maria Elena Durazo, Executive Secretary-Treasurer of the Los Angeles County Federation of Labor, AFL-CIO

All four individuals are examples of how organized efforts make an enormous difference. One of the topics they will address is: Moving from Charity to Justice.

#### **CBE ON THE MOVE?**

An opportunity for a permanent home for Congregation B'nai Emet and its Preschool and the Jewish Life Center has been presented to us.

Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, located at 9 West Bonita in Simi Valley, has been put up for sale. The church sits on 3.61 acres of land and has two separate buildings, a sanctuary with offices and storage and a preschool with classrooms, a kitchen and an office.

Both the CBE and JLC Boards appointed a Feasibility Committee (FC), chaired by Jeff Ringer, with Carole Fineberg, Susie Fintz, Illise Holran and Eric Bordo as members. After many weeks of exhaustive work and research, the FC presented their results to both boards. Following a review and discussions of those findings, the FC composed a "Letter of Intent" (LOI) to purchase the land and then present this letter to the broker/church. This presentation of the LOI was done on Thursday, August 16, by Michael Mutal, the President of the JLC, Eric Bordo, an FC member, and Earl Rosado, CBE President.

The church graciously offered us the use of their facility for our Friday service on August 24, so that our congregants could see the facility first hand. Congregants were invited to arrive early to see the property.

A capacity crowd enjoyed Rabbi Michele's service, with Cantor Russ, and later partook in a lovely oneg on the terrace of the Church overlooking Simi Valley. Special thanks should go to the Men's Club and Sisterhood for making the evening so successful.

Although there are many hurdles to overcome, we are hopeful that this opportunity is the start of great things for Congregation B'nai Emet.



#### How to observe a Yahrzeit at C.B.E


